You need clothes, so you go to The Gap in order to find what you need. In other words, it's not that these places just want your money (although, rest assured, they do). But they are indeed providing something you absolutely need.

We need God. We need spiritual guidance. We need spiritual light. We need to reach the world for Jesus Christ. We need to help families find their way. If we can go to the grocery store for physical food, then we ought to be willing to come to the House of God for spiritual food without whining about it. The question is not, does the church want my money? The question is, does the church serve good food? Indeed, we do.
